RULES - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. Please bring your entries **between 9.00 and 11.00 a.m.**, having highlighted the relevant class numbers and written your name, address and phone number below. **Please note that if you wish to bring your car up to church, it will have to be before 10.00 a.m., as vehicles may not enter the churchyard after that time!**
2. Produce will be auctioned later in the afternoon unless section notes indicate otherwise. If you do not wish your exhibits to be auctioned it is your responsibility to remove them after 3pm.
3. **You may only make one entry in each class;** you are responsible for displaying your entries on the appropriate table.
4. Entries to be made by donation (e.g. minimum donation 20p per class) with all proceeds going to the Church.
5. Stewards are on hand to give you any help you require when setting up.
6. Items without an exhibitor number label will not be judged.
7. Exhibitors must leave the church by 11.00 a.m. Judging takes place between 11.00 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. Judges' decisions must be accepted as final.
8. The show opens to the public from around 1.30 p.m. until the produce is put together for the auction at shortly after 3.30 p.m.
9. Winners of section cups should be available for presentation of their awards from around 3.30 p.m. - please listen out for announcements! Merit cards will be at the back of the church after the show - please pick up any you win from there.

Even if you are an experienced exhibitor we strongly recommend that you carefully read both the schedule AND the notes for exhibitors (found at the back of St. Bartholomew's or e-mail Nick Reading at nick@readingdesigns.co.uk for a copy), so that you are sure exactly what is being asked for. Every year, sadly, we have a number of exhibits which cannot be judged because they are incorrect - wrong number of items, unsterilised jam jars etc. - so if in doubt, ask!

SECTION 1

The ST. BARTHOLOMEW CUP will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest number of points in ALL classes. The cup will be held for twelve months. There are cups for the exhibitor with most points in each of the VEGETABLES & FRUIT and FLOWER sections.

Merit awards: 1st - 3 points, 2nd - 2 points, 3rd - 1 point

EXCEPT Class 1 merit award: 1st - 6 points, 2nd - 4 points, 3rd - 2 points AND Class 32 - just for fun, no points!

All exhibits in this section MUST have been grown by the exhibitor. Exhibitors should provide proper display items (see separate "Notes for Exhibitors" if you are not sure what this involves) and remove all receptacles not required for showing.

SECTION 2 - FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS

The DICK & MARY GOULBOURNE CUP will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest number of points in ALL classes. The cup will be held for twelve months. A Runner-up cup will be awarded to the exhibitor with the next highest number of points in all classes. The cup will be held for twelve months.

Merit awards: 1st - 3 points; 2nd - 2 points; 3rd - 1 point. EXCEPT Class 52 merit award: 1st - 6 points, 2nd - 4 points, 3rd - 2 points

The flowers used need not have been grown by the exhibitor **EXCEPT FOR CLASS 55 WHICH MUST BE GARDEN FLOWERS AND GREENERY ONLY**. Accessories are permitted. Arrangements remain the property of the exhibitor, but may be used to decorate the church after the show.

Class

- 52** An arrangement of flowers and foliage to fit an alcove measuring approximately 800 mm (2' 8") wide, 400 mm (1' 4") deep and 600 mm (2' 0") high
- 53** An arrangement in a woven basket with handle which must remain visible; any size **as long as smaller than Class 52**
- 54** Petite table arrangement measuring maximum 8" (20 cm) in height, width and depth
- 55** An arrangement using **GARDEN FLOWERS AND GREENERY ONLY**
- 56** Free arrangement – any size, any accessories, any container; bought or garden flowers/foilage acceptable
- 57** An arrangement with the theme 'Afternoon Tea'
- 58** An arrangement with the theme 'The Spirit of Autumn '

SECTION 3 - HOME-MADE DRINKS

The JIM HUTCHINGS CUP will be awarded to the exhibitor of the finest drink in the show. The cup will be held for twelve months. A Runner-up cup will be awarded to the exhibitor of the next finest drink in the show. The cup will be held for twelve months. The judges' points system will be used to award merits. CLEAR glass bottles must be used, preferably fitted with a flanged cork, and bearing a plain label indicating the type, ingredients and year. White wines include golden and tawny wines, red wines include rosé wines.

Class

- 59** Bottle of home-made alcoholic drink (wine, beer, cider etc.)
- 60** Bottle of home-made non-alcoholic drink (e.g. lemonade, cordial, ginger beer etc.)

SECTION 4 – DOMESTIC

The REGINALD UNDERHILL CUP will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest number of points in ALL classes. The cup will be held for twelve months. A Runner-up cup will be awarded to the exhibitor with the next highest number of points in all classes. The cup will be held for twelve months.

Merit awards: 1st - 3 points; 2nd - 2 points; 3rd - 1 point.

Preserves should be presented in a plain jar, with either a twist top or waxed disc and cellophane cover. Ideally, trade jars or lids should not be used. A label should be attached to all jars, naming the contents **and stating full date when made.**

SECTION 5 – COOKERY

The PETER & MAUREEN FROWLEY ROSE BOWL will be awarded to the exhibitor with the greatest number of points in ALL classes. The bowl will be held for twelve months. A Runner-up cup will be awarded to the exhibitor of the next highest number of points in all classes. The cup will be held for twelve months.

Merit awards: 1st - 3 points; 2nd - 2 points; 3rd - 1 point.

Disposable plates and clear polythene bags (to cover the exhibits) will be available.

SCHEDULE FOR JUNIOR SECTION AND PHOTO COMPETITION

All ages in this section to be taken as on the date of the Show. All entries MUST be exhibitors' own work. Work should be labelled with exhibitor's name and class on the back of paintings and underneath items. Only exhibitor's age should be visible to the judge. Items in all classes remain the property of the exhibitor and will not be sold at the auction.

- 85 Painting or collage of any subject (Max. size A3 (30 x 42 cm))
- 86 A poem about Tardebigge
- 87 A home-made greetings card
- 88 A monster made from vegetables, fruit or any natural plant material
- 89 Miniature garden no larger than 45 x 28 cm (a medium-sized tea-tray!)
- 90 **Original** model (**not** from a kit!) made with Meccano, Lego, K'nex etc., max. 600 x 600 mm
- 91 Six biscuits (needn't be home-made) decorated by the exhibitor
- 92 Six small home-made cakes decorated with funny faces
- 93 Any vegetable grown by a child
