#### From Richard, the Team Rector



I looked forward to bumper church attendances at Christmas; I was not disappointed. The Christingle service on Christmas Eve was full to overflowing; we ran out of service sheets; with more people crammed into church than for some years we were caught by surprise and will be looking to greatly improve our provision for next Christmas. Overall many people came to celebrate the birth of Jesus during what was our best children's attendance at Christmastime for a long time.

January is, sadly, a time when the local clergy expect to be involved in more funerals than usual. It is always a privilege to welcome people into church for funerals; while we live in a secularised age in which people are keen to tell everyone that they are not "religious", in fact many civil, "non-religious" funerals feature Christian material such as the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm, the Lord's Prayer, and hymns such as "Amazing Grace"; that is, they feature Christian material in their service while not being led by a Christian minister. This seems a little mixed-up, to me; it's not as if the Church insists on a rigid structure to a service in which poems and other non-Christian material cannot be included, while Jesus' resurrection alone points us to the truth about life after death. At a funeral more than any other time we need to be thinking about our future after our bodies cease to function.

In the modern age we can do so much to control the way we live our life on earth, and can choose from so many, many ways of enjoying it. We can have our pension plans, our healthcare plans and our retirement in which to find many joys and pleasures. When our bodies die, however, all control of our future is entirely out of our hands.

That is why it is so important that we entrust ourselves to Jesus, because he died and rose again, being seen in a number of different places, by well over 500 witnesses at

one time or another. Jesus came back from the dead so that we would know what life after death was like, and how to get there, so that our future after death can be so much more than the memories of those who knew us, but rather a fresh beginning in a new and immeasurably better form of existence than life here on earth.

What a wonderful hope to warm the heart and brighten lives in the cold, damp dark days of winter.





Roy was one of fifteen children of Claude and Nora Hims who lived in the last property along Crumpfields Lane, Webheath. He attended Bentley School until it closed, then from the age of eleven, Tardebigge School until he left at the age of thirteen to join his father's garage business. For six years he sang in the choir at Webheath Church.

After a spell in the army serving as sergeant in the Royal Artillery overseas in Korea, he worked in the Austin factory at Longbridge.

Following early retirement at the age of fifty nine he enjoyed twenty six years of life. He was married to Audrey until she died in 2006, then to Doreen until her death in 2010.

Latterly, Roy was a regular attender here at St. Bartholomew's and an active member of the Church Men's Group and the Evergreens. He was always ready to give lifts in his car so people could get to church services and other activities. He was always helpful and cheerful.

#### **Letter from the Bishop of Worcester**



Andreas Whittam Smith is best known as the man who started the Independent newspaper. Equally significantly, as First Estates Commissioner, he has effectively 'run' the Church Commissioners for quite a few years – and done so brilliantly. He's stepping down soon and late last year he addressed the House of Bishops. I was struck by what he said – that he feels more hopeful about the Church of England now than he has done for a long time.

That's quite something coming from a seasoned old hack like Andreas and I found it very encouraging. Why did he feel so hopeful? He felt the Church is at long last waking up to the fact that 'business as usual' is no longer an option and, more than that, is taking bold and innovative steps to reform and renew.

The scale of the challenge is enormous: The proportion of people in our country who have much understanding of the Christian faith, let alone practice it, is declining fast. What is needed is nothing less than the re-evangelisation of England. That's not an invitation to despair though, but a challenge to which, in the power of the living God, we can rise.

One exciting development in our diocese is the *Calling Young Disciples* project. Ruth Walker, its director, has already begun her ministry here and three Mission Enablers have already been appointed and will be taking up their posts soon. I hope and pray that their ministry will bear much fruit – not just to reverse the 'institutional decline' of the Church but bring people to a vibrant faith in the living God revealed in Jesus.

The renewal of the Church is not just up to them though; responsibility for it lies with us all. Please pray that we may all, as Kingdom People, fulfil our vocation to witness effectively to God's great love for everyone in Christ. May He make us instruments of his love, his compassion, his justice and His freedom.



#### **Celestial Corner**

February 1st, Imbolc in the Celtic year, the first day of celestial spring.

On this day the sun is roughly half way between the tropic of Capricorn and the equator on its journey north. After this date the day length will begin to increase at a noticeable pace up to the Vernal, or Spring, Equinox in March.

Orion and his companions are still dominating the southern sky during February so there is nothing we need to say about the stars this month.

So, what can we look for this month? By now Venus is getting near to its maximum brightness of -4 magnitude and is now the third brightest object in the sky after the sun and moon. It has been known to cast shadows in favourable conditions! At around 6pm the planet will be roughly in the south-west, so bright you can't miss it.

Not far from Venus is a "star" with an orangey tinge to it; this is Mars. Mars is now fading as it moves closer to the sun in the sky and will soon disappear from the evening sky as we leave it behind on our journey around the sun. After a period of time it will reappear in the morning sky just before sunrise and will slowly move away from the sun as we begin to catch it up once more.

Another planet in the morning sky at the moment is Jupiter. Slowly getting brighter as we play catch-up it will rise earlier each month until it rises before midnight and becomes an evening object again. At the time of writing this, (2<sup>nd</sup> January) Jupiter is in the south just before sunrise. Just rising in the south-east is Saturn. Obviously we shall see these two in more detail later in the year.



Here is a photo of the crescent Moon, Venus to the right and red Mars (if it shows up here; the arrow shows its location) on the left. It was taken on the evening of 2<sup>nd</sup> January around 6.10pm.






